
Local Government Elections 2024 Nomination Data

The VLGA has completed a thorough analysis of the nominations for the 2024 local government elections. Here are some of the interesting insights we've found.

Total Nominations

The 2024 Local Government Elections received a record number of nominations, with 2211 people raising their hand to run.

39.6% are women. **0.5%** identify as non-binary.

Councillors Restanding

417 (67%) of current councillors are re-standing for election 67% of current male councillors and 70% of current female councillors are re-contesting.



Number of women standing for election has increased

In 2024, **876 women** are standing for election. This is a 2.9% increase from 2020. However, below what is required to meet the target of 50/50 representation by 2025.



Women standing in metro and regional areas

More women are putting their hand up in regional areas, making up 37% of candidates.
40% of candidates in metropolitan municipalities are female.

Metropolitan Nominations

Wyndham (92), Casey (89), Melbourne (80) and Bayside (69) have the highest number of nominations. Interface 482
